

State-funded health care system is chronically:

- underfunded
- understaffed
- poorly organized

The waiting time for "free" procedures can take many years.


POLISH HEALTH CARE SYSTEM IN CRISIS

- Low earnings are forcing doctors to work overtime,
- Or/and take additional jobs at private clinics,
- or to emigrate;

"If junior doctors are receiving lower salaries than supermarket cashiers, then there's a problem, - NIL president Maciej Hamankiewicz (Chamber of Physicians and Dentists)

 Doctors, especially young, work between 300 and 400 hours a month, often in a state of chronic fatigue




POLISH HEALTH SYSTEM PERFORMANCE


- WHO: Poland 50. (France 1., UK 18.)
- EHCI (Euro Health Consumer Index): Poland 31. (out of 35)

According to president Hamankiewicz, around **25,000 Polish doctors currently work abroad**, including 13,000 in other EU states




ROLE OF LOCAL GOVERNMENTS

- Prevention, selected medical procedures (in-vitro)
- Dedicated forms of health care (e.g. geriatric centers)
- Citizens' initiatives (e.g. civic budget)
- Urban greenery
- Recreation


PREVENTIVE ACTIONS FOR URBAN CITIZENS

- Preventive programs in addition to obligatory ones e.g. free HPV vaccination, screening tests
- Prevention days (free medical check up)
- Medical programs aimed at children at schools




ELDERLY CARE

- First aid trainings for citizens
- Defibrillators in public spaces



WHY LOCAL INITIATIVES MATTER?

- People get involved more if they are given initiative (e.g. civic budget actions)
